



## Elmhurst at Illinois Wesleyan October 13, 2018, 1 p.m. Tucci Stadium, Bloomington, Ill.

**THE GAME:** Illinois Wesleyan (4-1 overall, 4-0 College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin) continues its 127<sup>th</sup> football season with a conference game against Elmhurst College (1-4, 0-4 CCIW) with a 1 p.m. kickoff at Tucci Stadium in Bloomington, Ill.

**ON THE AIR:** The IWU/Elmhurst game will be broadcast live on the Internet at [www.wjbc.com](http://www.wjbc.com) and will be streamed at [www.iwusports.com](http://www.iwusports.com)

**POLLING PLACE:** The Illinois Wesleyan football team remained at No. 18 (second straight week) in the Oct. 7 D3football.com top 25 ... From the CCIW, Wheaton jumped up to No. 12 and North Central is No. 17 for the second straight week ... Mount Union is No. 1, followed by Mary Hardin Baylor, St. Thomas and Brockport ... Illinois Wesleyan improved to No. 19 (after two weeks at No. 21) in the American Football Coaches Assn. poll. Wheaton moved up to No. 15 and North Central is No. 16.

**OCTOBER:** The Titans are 90-49 (.640 winning mark) in the month during the Norm Eash coaching tenure, including a 1-0 record this season ... IWU was 4-0 in 2017, 4-1 in 2016, 4-1 in October 2015, 1-3 in October 2014, 4-0 in October 2013, 2-2 in October 2012, 4-1 in October 2011, 3-2 in October in 2010, 4-1 in October 2009, 2-2 in October 2008 and 4-0 in October 2007.

**GAME #1,043 AHEAD:** In its 127<sup>th</sup> season, IWU has an overall 1,043-game record of 589-412-42 (.583 winning percentage) ... Of the 1,043 games, head coach **Norm Eash** has been involved in 345 of them (309 as a coach, 36 as a player from 1971-74) ... Illinois Wesleyan's 35-27 win at Albion on Sept. 13, 2014 was the 1,000<sup>th</sup> game in Illinois Wesleyan football history.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Since Norm Eash became head coach in 1987, Illinois Wesleyan is 111-45 (.708) at home and 93-59-1 on the road (.603).



**LAST WEEK:** After a more than two hour lightning delay at the start of the game, the No. 18-ranked Illinois Wesleyan football team went to two overtime possessions to earn a 40-34 win over Carthage College on Homecoming Saturday, Oct. 6, at Tucci Stadium. The win keeps IWU unbeaten in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin at 4-0 and 4-1 overall while the Red Men are 2-3 overall and 2-2 in the CCIW ... IWU junior quarterback **Brandon Bauer (Frankfort, Ill., Lincoln-Way East HS)** tied a school single game record with 34 completions in 55 attempts for 361 yards with two TD throws, including the 4-yard game-winner to junior wide receiver **Jack Healy (Northfield, Ill., Glenbrook South HS)** on the second overtime possession ... Healy led Bauer's receiving corps with 11 grabs for 141 yards with junior wide receiver **Dean Zigulich (Riverside, Riverside-Brookfield HS)** collecting nine balls for 93 yards and a score and junior running back **Bryce Dooley (LeRoy, Ill., LeRoy HS)** making nine catches for 77 yards. Dooley also threw a 9-yard halfback pass to Bauer ... Senior **Morgan Alexander (Elmhurst, York HS)** rushed 24 times for 27 total yards and remains No. 19 all-time in IWU rushing yards with 1,496 ... Kicker **Patrick Tata (Deerfield, Ill., Loyola Academy)** also tied a school record with four field goals - 30 yards, 27 yards, 33 yards and a 37-yarder in the first overtime possession ... The Titans amassed 401 yards of total offense with 370 coming in the air and 31 on the ground while the Red Men, who scored 21 fourth quarter points to rally from a 23-10 deficit after three periods, gained a total of 424 yards with 241 via the pass and 183 rushing ... Defensively, junior defensive back **Trevor Koepke (Tinley Park HS)** had nine total tackles with two pass breakups and sophomore linebacker **Keenan Scott (Riverside, Riverside-Brookfield HS)** had eight total tackles. Senior lineman **Eric Dubose (Willowbrook, Hinsdale South HS)** had seven total tackles with two quarterback sacks accounting for 19 yards of loss. Junior lineman **Dave Lux (Tinley Park, Lincoln-Way North HS)** also made a quarterback sack for -8 yards ... Three Titans had interceptions - senior linebacker **Andrew Ostrowski (LaGrange,**

**Lyons Township HS), senior safety Trevor Staley (Lake Zurich HS) and junior Nico Gubenko (Wheaton, Wheaton North HS), who also recovered a Carthage fumble.**

**CCIW HONORS:** Illinois Wesleyan junior kicker **Patrick Tata (Deerfield, Ill., Loyola Academy)** was selected as the CCIW Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 28 ... Tata tied a school record with four field goals in a 40-34 overtime win over Carthage on Saturday. He connected on field goals of 30, 27, 33 and 37 yards in the win. His 37-yard field goal in overtime tied the game at 34-34 ... Other Titans who have made four field goals in a game are Jason Blaskovich (at Quincy, Sept. 28, 1991) and Brian Klesath (vs. North Central, Oct. 19, 2002).

**PREVIOUS CCIW HONORS:** Tata is the second Titan to win CCIW Player of the Week honors this season. Other CCIW weekly winners from Illinois Wesleyan in 2018:

**COACH NORM EASH:** The "dean" of league coaches and winningest coach in school history, **Norm Eash** (Illinois Wesleyan, 1975) is in his 32<sup>nd</sup> season at IWU ... He has a career overall record of 204-104-1 (.657) and a career CCIW mark of 146-81-1 (.631) ... The conference win over Wheaton (24-14, Sept. 15, 2018) moved Eash into the all-time lead for the most CCIW coaching victories. He passed his former head coach **Don "Swede" Larson**, who was 142-89-6 in 33 seasons (.612)... Eash became the school's all-time football coaching win leader with a 52-21 victory over North Park on Oct. 12, 2013 ... He surpassed the record held by his own college coach, **Larson** (168-121-6 from 1954-86) ... Eash has been CCIW "Coach of the Year" six times (2017, 2009, 2007, 2001, 1996, 1992) ... The win at Augustana on Oct. 17, 2009, was Eash's 100<sup>th</sup> CCIW win.

**WORKING OVERTIME:** Last week's 40-34 win was the first overtime game for Illinois Wesleyan since Sept. 29, 2012 ... The Titans are 6-1 all-time in overtime games (5-1 at home).

1 – In Bloomington, IWU defeated Washington U., 31-24, on Sept. 21, 2002 when Eric White caught a 10-yard pass from Josh Akin for the score and Brian Klesath added the extra point before the Titan defense held the Bears.

2 - In Decatur on Oct. 14, 2006, the Titans beat the Big Blue 12-6. The winning score came when Nick Panno hit Martin Ceisel with an 11-yard TD pass.

3 - In Bloomington, IWU beat North Central, 28-22, on Oct. 31, 2009. After holding the Cardinals, IWU scored in five plays on a 10-yard pass from Kraig Ladd to Michael Sloboda.

4 – In Bloomington, IWU beat Wabash 41-35 in the second OT possession in a Nov. 21, 2009 NCAA playoff game. Jack Scalucci caught a 30-yard TD pass from Kraig Ladd on a fourth and 15 play for the winning score. The game was 28-28 after regulation and both teams scored in their first possession. The P.J. Cummings intercepted a pass to end Wabash's second OT drive before the IWU score.

5 - IWU lost a home NCAA playoff game in the third overtime to Monmouth, 33-27, on Nov. 19, 2011. The teams tied 17-17 at the end of regulation and played through two rounds of overtime with alternating possessions. On IWU's third OT possession, Rob Gallik fumbled the ball at the 1-yard line to give the ball to the Scots. Monmouth's Trey

Yocum ran four times for 30 yards in the final OT, including a 7-yard TD rush for the winning score.

6 - Illinois Wesleyan won, 34-33 in overtime vs. Millikin at Tucci Stadium on Sept. 29, 2012. Tyrell Bolden broke up a two-point conversion pass to preserve the one-point win. IWU got the ball first and Sean Conley ran 4 yards for a score. Michael Kelley's kick gave IWU a 34-27 lead. Millikin matched the TD but failed on a two-point pass play.

**ALEXANDER ON THE RUN:** In career rankings, senior RB **Morgan Alexander (Elmhurst, Ill., York HS)** now has 1496 rushing yards, good for No. 19 all-time at IWU. Just ahead of him are Aaron Telford with 1538 (from 1998-2001) and Devonte Jones with 1544 (2011-13).

**BAUER'S CAREER:** Against Carthage, junior QB **Brandon Bauer (Frankfort, Ill., Lincoln-Way East HS)** tied a school single game record with 34 completions in 55 attempts for 361 yards with two TD throws, including the 4-yard game-winner to junior wide receiver **Jack Healy (Northfield, Ill., Glenbrook South HS)** on the second overtime possession. Doug Moews previously had 34 completions against Wheaton on Oct. 7, 1987. Bauer's 55 attempts is third most in an IWU game and the 361 passing yards is seventh most.

In career rankings, **Bauer** now has 435 completions in 715 attempts for 5,098 yards with a 60.8 completion percentage.

**BEHIND ENEMY LINES:** Elmhurst has lost four straight games after winning their season opener at Aurora, 21-20 ... The Bluejays have lost to Augustana (35-0), Carroll (16-14), Carthage (63-7) and Washington U. (23-10) ... Injuries have hurt the Bluejays this season – they have used four quarterbacks in their last three games ... Last week, Elmhurst gained 234 yards with 117 in the air and 117 on the ground. Ben

Holloway led Elmhurst's ground attack with 57 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries. Orlando

Hernandez was 8-for-15 for 34 passing yards and ran for 57 yards on seven carries, plying just the second half.

Chase Hankins completed 15-of-22 passes for 83 yards as the Bluejays were sacked a total of six times ... Brandon

Dominski led the Elmhurst defense with 10 tackles, including a half sack, and recovered a mid-air fumble and

returned it 27 yards. Brandon Greeg added eight tackles while Romain Richards and Luke Coon had sacks ... Ron

Planz (Carthage 2001) has a 13-28 record in his fifth season at Elmhurst. Planz spent five seasons as defensive line

coach and special teams coordinator at Division II Minnesota St.-Mankato. While there, the Mavericks won four

Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) South Division titles, three NSIC conference championships, qualified

for the NCAA playoffs three times, including a national semifinal appearance in 2012. Prior to joining Mavericks'

coaching staff in 2009, Planz served as the defensive coordinator at Manchester College for five seasons and spent

three years as an assistant at Wis.-Eau Claire. He was the defensive coordinator for the Danube Dragons in

Klosterneuburg, Austria, in 2002.

## THE SERIES VS. ELMHURST (53-12-1)      Home: 36-3, Away: 17-9

In a series that dates back to 1930, Illinois Wesleyan holds a 53-12-1 lead in games vs. Elmhurst (36-3 at home, 17-9-1 on the road) ... IWU has won nine of the last 11 and 28 of the last 35 games between the two schools ... The Bluejays won at home in both 2006 (25-13) and in 2005 (20-15)...When Elmhurst beat IWU, 40-20, in 2003, it ended a 17-game winning streak against the Bluejays.

**UNDER THE LIGHTS:** Since bringing lights back to Tucci Stadium in 2001, Illinois Wesleyan has a 10-3 home record under the lights... Last week was the 13<sup>th</sup> home night football game at IWU's Wilder Field since 1971...The Oct. 25, 2008 game was the latest night game on the calendar at home in at least 43 years. In 2002, IWU won its first overtime game in a 31-24 decision over Washington U. The Titans were to have played Aurora at night on Sept. 15, 2001, but the game was cancelled after the national tragedies of Sept. 11.
