THE GAME: Illinois Wesleyan (6-1 overall, 6-0 College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin) continues its 127th football season with a conference game against Millikin (6-1, 5-1 CCIW) with a 6 p.m. kickoff at Frank M. Lindsay Field in Decatur, Ill.

ON THE AIR: The IWU/Millikin game will be broadcast live on WJBC Radio 1230 AM and on the Internet at www.wjbc.com.

POLLING PLACE: The Illinois Wesleyan football team improved two positions to No. 15 (from No. 17) in the Oct. 21 D3football.com top 25 ... From the CCIW, North Central is up to No. 12 (from 15) and Wheaton dropped out but is receiving votes along with WashU and Millikin ... Mount Union is No. 1, followed by Mary Hardin Baylor, Brockport and St. John's ... Illinois Wesleyan is No. 17 (after two weeks at No. 19) in the American Football Coaches Assn. poll. North Central is No. 13 (up from No. 15).

OCTOBER: The Titans are 92-49 (.640 winning mark) in the month during the Norm Eash coaching tenure, including a 3-0 record this season ... IWU was 4-0 in 2017, 4-1 in 2016, 4-1 in October 2015, 1-3 in October 2014, 4-0 in October 2013, 2-2 in October 2012, 4-1 in October 2011, 3-2 in October in 2010, 4-1 in October 2009, 2-2 in October 2008 and 4-0 in October 2007.

GAME #1,046 AHEAD: In its 127th season, IWU has an overall 1,045-game record of 591-412-42 (.583 winning percentage) ... Of the 1,045 games, head coach **Norm Eash** has been involved in 347 of them (311 as a coach, 36 as a player from 1971-74) ... Illinois Wesleyan's 35-27 win at Albion on Sept. 13, 2014 was the 1,000th game in Illinois Wesleyan football history.

HOME AND AWAY: Since Norm Eash became head coach in 1987, Illinois Wesleyan is 112-45 (.708) at home and 94-59-1 on the road (.603).



LAST WEEK: ST. LOUIS, Mo. – The No. 17-ranked Illinois Wesleyan football team held off a furious late rally to hang on for a 27-21 win over Washington U. at Francis Field in St. Louis, Mo., on Oct. 20. The Titans won for the sixth straight week and are 6-1 overall and remain in first place at 6-0 in the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin while the Bears are 5-2 overall and 4-2 in their first season in the CCIW ... Illinois Wesleyan junior QB **Brandon Bauer (Frankfort, Ill., Lincoln-Way East HS)** rushed for touchdowns of 1 yard, 1 yard and 3 yards and completed 26 of 32 pass attempts for 254 yards and a touchdown of 2 yards to senior RB **Morgan Alexander (Elmhurst, York HS)** ... Alexander ran for 110 yards on 29 carries as the Titans rolled up 363 yards of total offense with 109 coming on the ground and 254 in the air. WashU had 351 yards of offense with 85 rushing and 266 passing. IWU had a 37:40-22:20 advantage in time of possession, and the Bears were called for a season-high nine penalties and had two turnovers ... Juniors **Zach Walsh (Lombard, Glenbard East HS)** and **Dean Zigulich (Riverside, Riverside-Brookfield HS)** each made seven receptions with Walsh getting 84 yards and Zigulich 69 receiving yards. Junior **Jack Healy (Northfield, Ill., Glenbrook South HS)** also had five catches for 76 yards ... Defensively, sophomore LB **Keenan Scott (Riverside, Riverside-Brookfield HS)** had 13 total tackles and junior LB **Ryan Swift (Brookfield, Riverside-Brookfield HS)** made 10. Sophomore lineman **Mike Murphy (Orland Park, Sandburg HS)** made the Titans' only quarterback sack and senior safety **Trevor Staley (Lake Zurich HS)** had six tackles and made his fourth interception of the season (11th of his career). Senior DE **Eric Dubose (Willowbrook, Hinsdale South HS)** had a tackle for a loss of -18 yards along with forcing and recovering a fumble. The Titans built up a 21-7 halftime lead before WashU rallied to tie the game with two third quarter scores. Bauer's third TD run came with 14 seconds left in the third quarter to cap a 15-play, 64-yard drive. Needing a touchdown to tie the game, WashU took over on their own 8 yard line with just 1:11 to play in the game but advanced no farther than the IWU 32 yard line before time expired.

WashU quarterback Johnny Davidson, who missed much of the first half with an ankle injury, completed 28 of 41 passes for 206 and a TD and John Fisher was their leading rusher with 61 yards on 13 carries. The Bears' defense, which sacked Bauer four times, was led by the 16 tackles from linebacker Jake Coon and 15 from defensive back Ben Marcus.

COACH NORM EASH: The "dean" of league coaches and winningest coach in school history, **Norm Eash** (Illinois Wesleyan, 1975) is in his 32nd season at IWU ... He has a career overall record of 206-104-1 (.657) and a career CCIW mark of 148-81-1 (.631) ... The conference win over Wheaton (24-14, Sept. 15, 2018) moved Eash into the all-time lead for the most CCIW coaching victories. He passed his former head coach **Don "Swede" Larson**, who was 142-89-6 in 33 seasons (.612)... Eash became the school's all-time football coaching win leader with a 52-21 victory over North Park on Oct. 12, 2013 ... He surpassed the record held by his own college coach, **Larson** (168-121-6 from 1954-86) ... Eash has been CCIW "Coach of the Year" six times (2017, 2009, 2007, 2001, 1996, 1992) ... The win at Augustana on Oct. 17, 2009, was Eash's 100th CCIW win.

BAUER'S CAREER: Against Carthage, junior QB **Brandon Bauer (Frankfort, Ill., Lincoln-Way East HS)** tied a school single game record with 34 completions in 55 attempts for 361 yards with two TD throws, including the 4-yard game-winner to junior wide receiver **Jack Healy (Northfield, Ill., Glenbrook South HS)** on the second overtime possession. Doug Moews previously had 34 completions against Wheaton on Oct. 7, 1987. Bauer's 55 attempts is third most in an IWU game and the 361 passing yards is seventh most.

- Has 16 career rushing TDs, tied for 10th most in an IWU uniform
- His 11 rushing TDs this year is fourth best in an IWU season
- Has completed 183 passes this season, just 21 from tying IWU single season record of 204 set by Rob Gallik in 2003 (204 of 326)
- With three regular season games left, Bauer has 2,131 passing yards, 434 yards from tying the season record of 2,565 set by Tom Monken in 1992 ...
- Went 26 of 32 vs. WashU and that 81.3 accuracy is the eighth best in an IWU single game

TATA TIES RECORD: Illinois Wesleyan junior kicker **Patrick Tata (Deerfield, Ill., Loyola Academy)** tied a school record with four field goals in a 40-34 OT win over Carthage on Oct. 6. He connected on field goals of 30, 27, 33 and 37 yards in the win. His 37-yard field goal in overtime tied the game at 34-34 ... Other Titans who have made four field goals in a game are **Jason Blaskovich** (at Quincy, Sept. 28, 1991) and **Brian Klesath** (vs. North Central, Oct. 19, 2002).



BEHIND ENEMY LINES: Millikin survived a determined Elmhurst team, brutal weather conditions and a rash of injuries to defeat the Bluejays 14-13 on Oct. 20 in Elmhurst ... Trailing 13-7, Millikin scored the game winning touchdown with 5:22 left in the game when quarterback Cal Pohrte connected with Tyrice Hines on a diving catch in the end for a 33-yard touchdown. William Raibley's extra point gave Millikin the 14-13 lead and the Big Blue

defense held the Bluejays on their final possession securing the victory ... The game featured unfavorable weather conditions in the first half with gusting winds 30-40 miles per hour and temperatures dropping from 50 to 35 degrees in a matter of minutes. The second quarter included a sleet storm lasting several minutes ... The Big Blue started the game without starting quarterback Nicco Stepina and linebacker Nikia Averitte. During the game the Big Blue lost other key players to injuries including its top two running backs. Jazontae Howard answered for Millikin with a six yard run to tie the game in the second quarter and finished the game with 142 yards on 18 carries, all coming in the first half before missing the second half with an injury. Freshman Richard Cosey had 21 carries for 62 yards. Pohrte finished 5-of-18 passing for 79 yards ... Millikin had 312 yards of total offense including 233 yards rushing. Elmhurst had 277 yards of total offense ... Matt Brown and Davion Jefferson led Millikin with eight tackles each with Brown making 2.5 tackles for a loss ... Dan Gritti is in his third year as Big Blue head coach and has an overall record of 17-10. He came to Millikin after five years as Rhodes' head coach, where his teams were 29-19 with the school's first SAA title in 26 years. Rhodes had back-to-back 8-2 seasons in 2013 and 2014, setting a school record for most wins over a two-year period.

THE SERIES VS. MILLIKIN (49-54-7)

Dating back to 1904, Millikin has a 54-49-7 lead over IWU but the Titans have won eight in a row and 14 of the last 18 meetings, including a 31-6 win in Bloomington last season ... Millikin won nine consecutive games in the series from 1982-90 ... Despite being 110 games old, the rivalry isn't in the top 15 of Division III longest series.

SEPTEMBER: The Titans are 71-23-1 (.745) in the Norm Eash coaching era in the month, including a 3-1 record in 2018 ... IWU was 4-1 in September in 2017 and 2-1 in September 2016 ... The Titans had a 22-game September winning streak ended with the loss at Simpson in 2014 ... The last loss before that was on Sept. 15, 2007 to Mt. St. Joseph... IWU teams won 11 straight September games (all non-league) from 1995 (loss at Simpson) until 2001 (loss to Washington U.).

SEASON OPENERS: IWU is 20-12 (.625) in opening-day games under Norm Eash, including the 34-31 loss to Wisconsin-LaCrosse on Sept. 8, 2018 ... The loss snapped a streak of 10 straight season-opening games after losing five in a row from 2003 to 2007.

WORKING OVERTIME: The 40-34 win over Carthage on Oct. 6, 2018, was the first overtime game for Illinois Wesleyan since Sept. 29, 2012 ... The Titans are 6-1 all-time in overtime games (5-1 at home).

1 – In Bloomington, IWU defeated Washington U., 31-24, on Sept. 21, 2002 when Eric White caught a 10-yard pass from Josh Akin for the score and Brian Klesath added the extra point before the Titan defense held the Bears.

2 - In Decatur on Oct. 14, 2006, the Titans beat the Big Blue 12-6. The winning score came when Nick Panno hit Martin Ceisel with an 11-yard TD pass.

3 - In Bloomington, IWU beat North Central, 28-22, on Oct. 31, 2009. After holding the Cardinals, IWU scored in five plays on a 10-yard pass from Kraig Ladd to Michael Sloboda.

4 – In Bloomington, IWU beat Wabash 41-35 in the second OT possession in a Nov. 21, 2009 NCAA playoff game. Jack Scalcucci caught a 30-yard TD pass from Kraig Ladd on a fourth and 15 play for the winning score. The game was 28-28 after regulation and both teams scored in their first possession. The P.J. Cummings intercepted a pass to end Wabash's second OT drive before the IWU score.

5 - IWU lost a home NCAA playoff game in the third overtime to Monmouth, 33-27, on Nov. 19, 2011. The teams tied 17-17 at the end of regulation and played through two rounds of overtime with alternating possessions. On IWU's third OT possession, Rob Gallik fumbled the ball at the 1-yard line to give the ball to the Scots. Monmouth's Trey Yocum ran four times for 30 yards in the final OT, including a 7-yard TD rush for the winning score.

6 - Illinois Wesleyan won, 34-33 in overtime vs. Millikin at Tucci Stadium on Sept. 29, 2012. Tyrell Bolden broke up a two-point conversion pass to preserve the one-point win. IWU got the ball first and Sean Conley ran 4 yards for a score. Michael Kelley's kick gave IWU a 34-27 lead. Millikin matched the TD but failed on a two-point pass play.
