



## Illinois Wesleyan at Washington U. October 20, 2018, 6 p.m. Francis Field, St. Louis, Mo.

**THE GAME:** Illinois Wesleyan (5-1 overall, 5-0 College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin) continues its 127<sup>th</sup> football season with a conference game against Washington U. (5-1, 4-1 CCIW) with a 6 p.m. kickoff at Francis Field in St. Louis, Mo.

**ON THE AIR:** The IWU/WashU game will be broadcast live on the Internet at [www.wjbc.com](http://www.wjbc.com).

**POLLING PLACE:** The Illinois Wesleyan football team improved one position to No. 17 (from No. 18 for two straight weeks) in the Oct. 14 D3football.com top 25 ... From the CCIW, Wheaton dropped to No. 23 (from No. 12) and North Central is up to No. 15 after two weeks at No. 17 ... Mount Union is No. 1, followed by Mary Hardin Baylor, Brockport and Frostburg State ... Illinois Wesleyan is No. 19 for second straight week (after two weeks at No. 21) in the American Football Coaches Assn. poll. Wheaton dropped out of poll and North Central is No. 15.

**OCTOBER:** The Titans are 91-49 (.640 winning mark) in the month during the Norm Eash coaching tenure, including a 2-0 record this season ... IWU was 4-0 in 2017, 4-1 in 2016, 4-1 in October 2015, 1-3 in October 2014, 4-0 in October 2013, 2-2 in October 2012, 4-1 in October 2011, 3-2 in October in 2010, 4-1 in October 2009, 2-2 in October 2008 and 4-0 in October 2007.

**GAME #1,044 AHEAD:** In its 127<sup>th</sup> season, IWU has an overall 1,044-game record of 590-412-42 (.583 winning percentage) ... Of the 1,044 games, head coach **Norm Eash** has been involved in 346 of them (310 as a coach, 36 as a player from 1971-74) ... Illinois Wesleyan's 35-27 win at Albion on Sept. 13, 2014 was the 1,000<sup>th</sup> game in Illinois Wesleyan football history.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Since Norm Eash became head coach in 1987, Illinois Wesleyan is 112-45 (.708) at home and 93-59-1 on the road (.603).



**LAST WEEK:** Senior **Morgan Alexander (Elmhurst, York HS)** rushed for a career-high 218 yards with two touchdowns and junior **Zach Walsh (Lombard, Glenbard East HS)** was on the receiving end of three TD passes as the No. 18-ranked Illinois Wesleyan Titans rolled past Elmhurst, 44-28, at Tucci Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 13 ... The Titans, who built up a 30-7 halftime advantage, had 578 yards of offense, the fifth highest in a single game for an Illinois Wesleyan team as the Titans had 282 rushing and 296 passing ... Alexander's previous game high was 142 yards, done against Augustana and North Park in 2017, and the total of 218 is the ninth most in an IWU single game. Alexander's big day gives him 1,714 career rushing yards, good for No. 13 all-time at IWU ... Junior **Brandon Bauer (Frankfort, Ill., Lincoln-Way East HS)** threw for 291 yards on 19 of 29 passing with the three scores to Walsh of 1, 30, and 16 yards ... Walsh had 84 receiving yards on six catches and junior **Jack Healy (Northfield, Ill., Glenbrook South HS)** had 88 receiving yards on five grabs ... IWU was led defensively by junior linebacker **Ryan Swift (Brookfield, Riverside-Brookfield HS)** with nine total tackles and a forced fumble, while **Keenan Scott (Riverside, Riverside-Brookfield HS)** had six tackles. Junior safety **Nico Gubenko (Wheaton, Wheaton North HS)** and senior safety **Trevor Staley (Lake Zurich HS)** each had interceptions and junior **Trevor Koepke (Tinley Park HS)** recovered a fumble ... Junior defensive linemen **Chance Hilliard (Marion, Ill., Marion HS)** and **Derrick Frye (Posen, Ill., Brother Rice HS)** issued quarterback sacks for the Titans.

**IWU PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:** Chosen by Titan coaches to honor top players in the week's game and practices. The "Titan Award" honors a player for work ethic, loyalty and spirit.

**COACH NORM EASH:** The "dean" of league coaches and winningest coach in school history, **Norm Eash** (Illinois Wesleyan, 1975) is in his 32<sup>nd</sup> season at IWU ... He has a career overall record of 205-104-1 (.657) and a career CCIW mark of 147-81-1 (.631) ... The conference win over Wheaton (24-14, Sept. 15, 2018) moved Eash into the all-time lead for the most CCIW coaching victories. He passed his former head coach **Don "Swede" Larson**, who was 142-89-6 in 33 seasons (.612)... Eash became the school's all-time football coaching win leader with a 52-21 victory over North Park on Oct. 12, 2013 ... He surpassed the record held by his own college coach, **Larson** (168-121-6 from 1954-86) ... Eash has been CCIW "Coach of the Year" six times (2017, 2009, 2007, 2001, 1996, 1992) ... The win at Augustana on Oct. 17, 2009, was Eash's 100<sup>th</sup> CCIW win.

**BEHIND ENEMY LINES:** WashU picked up its first victory over a ranked team in eight years in the 17-10 win over No. 12 Wheaton on Oct. 14. The Bears defeated then No. 19 Wabash College 24-20 at home on Oct. 9, 2010 ... Junior punter Johnny Davidson and sophomore defensive lineman Peter Pigatti were named the CCIW Special Teams and Defensive Player of the Week following their performances in the 17-10 win over No. 12 Wheaton. Davidson averaged 39.6 yards per punt and landed three inside the 20, while Pigatti recorded five tackles and 3.5 sacks. WashU's defense held Wheaton to -3 yards rushing, forced three turnovers and nine punts and limited the Thunder to 1-of-14 on third down ... WashU has posted a 23-6 (.793) record at Francis Field in the past six seasons. The Bears have won five-straight contests at home dating back to last season ... WashU ranks in the top-20 in NCAA Division III in four categories: sacks per game (4.33, fifth), completion percentage (0.688, 13th), fourth-down percentage (0.714, 13th) and tackles for loss per game (9.0, 19th) ... WashU head coach Larry Kindbom (Kalamazoo, 1974) is in his 30th season leading the Bears, with a record of 182-115 (.613). His 181 wins rank him as the all-time winningest coach at WashU. Overall, in 36 seasons, Kindbom has a 210-145-1 (.591) overall record and led the Bears to three NCAA Division III playoff appearances ... WashU defensive coordinator Jeff Fisher is a 1993 Illinois Wesleyan graduate and played four years of varsity football for the Titans.

#### THE SERIES VS. WASHINGTON U. (8-9-0)

In a series that dates back to 1899, WashU has a 9-8-0 lead in the series against Illinois Wesleyan ... IWU has won six of the eight games played since Norm Eash has been coach for the Titans ... In 2002 the teams played the first game under the new lights at Tucci Stadium after the lights were removed in 1972.

**BAUER'S CAREER:** Against Carthage, junior QB **Brandon Bauer (Frankfort, Ill., Lincoln-Way East HS)** tied a school single game record with 34 completions in 55 attempts for 361 yards with two TD throws, including the 4-yard game-winner to junior wide receiver **Jack Healy (Northfield, Ill., Glenbrook South HS)** on the second overtime possession. Doug Moews previously had 34 completions against Wheaton on Oct. 7, 1987. Bauer's 55 attempts is third most in an IWU game and the 361 passing yards is seventh most.

**CCIW HONORS:** Illinois Wesleyan junior kicker **Patrick Tata (Deerfield, Ill., Loyola Academy)** was selected as the CCIW Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 28 ... Tata tied a school record with four field goals in a 40-34 overtime win over Carthage on Saturday. He connected on field goals of 30, 27, 33 and 37 yards in the win. His 37-yard field goal in overtime tied the game at 34-34 ... Other Titans who have made four field goals in a game are Jason Blaskovich (at Quincy, Sept. 28, 1991) and Brian Klesath (vs. North Central, Oct. 19, 2002).

**PREVIOUS CCIW HONORS:** Tata is the second Titan to win CCIW Player of the Week honors this season. Other CCIW weekly winners from Illinois Wesleyan in 2018:

**SEPTEMBER:** The Titans are 71-23-1 (.745) in the Norm Eash coaching era in the month, including a 3-1 record in 2018 ... IWU was 4-1 in September in 2017 and 2-1 in September 2016 ... The Titans had a 22-game September winning streak ended with the loss at Simpson in 2014 ... The last loss before that was on Sept. 15, 2007 to Mt. St. Joseph... IWU teams won 11 straight September games (all non-league) from 1995 (loss at Simpson) until 2001 (loss to Washington U.).

**SEASON OPENERS:** IWU is 20-12 (.625) in opening-day games under Norm Eash, including the 34-31 loss to Wisconsin-LaCrosse on Sept. 8, 2018 ... The loss snapped a streak of 10 straight season-opening games after losing five in a row from 2003 to 2007.

**WORKING OVERTIME:** The 40-34 win over Carthage on Oct. 6, 2018, was the first overtime game for Illinois Wesleyan since Sept. 29, 2012 ... The Titans are 6-1 all-time in overtime games (5-1 at home).

1 - In Bloomington, IWU defeated Washington U., 31-24, on Sept. 21, 2002 when Eric White caught a 10-yard pass from Josh Akin for the score and Brian Klesath added the extra point before the Titan defense held the Bears.

2 - In Decatur on Oct. 14, 2006, the Titans beat the Big Blue 12-6. The winning score came when Nick Panno hit Martin Ceisel with an 11-yard TD pass.

3 - In Bloomington, IWU beat North Central, 28-22, on Oct. 31, 2009. After holding the Cardinals, IWU scored in five plays on a 10-yard pass from Kraig Ladd to Michael Sloboda.

4 - In Bloomington, IWU beat Wabash 41-35 in the second OT possession in a Nov. 21, 2009 NCAA playoff game. Jack Scalcucci caught a 30-yard TD pass from Kraig Ladd on a fourth and 15 play for the winning score. The game was 28-28 after regulation and both teams scored in their first possession. The P.J. Cummings intercepted a pass to end Wabash's second OT drive before the IWU score.

5 - IWU lost a home NCAA playoff game in the third overtime to Monmouth, 33-27, on Nov. 19, 2011. The teams tied 17-17 at the end of regulation and played through two rounds of overtime with alternating possessions. On IWU's third OT possession, Rob Gallik fumbled the ball at the 1-yard line to give the ball to the Scots. Monmouth's Trey Yocum ran four times for 30 yards in the final OT, including a 7-yard TD rush for the winning score.

6 - Illinois Wesleyan won, 34-33 in overtime vs. Millikin at Tucci Stadium on Sept. 29, 2012. Tyrell Bolden broke up a two-point conversion pass to preserve the one-point win. IWU got the ball first and Sean Conley ran 4 yards for a score. Michael Kelley's kick gave IWU a 34-27 lead. Millikin matched the TD but failed on a two-point pass play.

7 - Illinois Wesleyan won, 40-34 in overtime vs. Carthage at Tucci Stadium on Oct. 6, 2018. Patrick Tata made a 37 yard field goal in the first overtime possession and Brandon Bauer threw a 4-yard TD pass to Jack Healy in the second OT possession.

**UNDER THE LIGHTS:** Since bringing lights back to Tucci Stadium in 2001, Illinois Wesleyan has a 10-3 home record under the lights... Last week was the 13<sup>th</sup> home night football game at IWU's Wilder Field since 1971...The Oct. 25, 2008 game was the latest night game on the calendar at home in at least 43 years. In 2002, IWU won its first overtime game in a 31-24 decision over Washington U. The Titans were to have played Aurora at night on Sept. 15, 2001, but the game was cancelled after the national tragedies of Sept. 11. Before 2002, the last home night game was on Oct. 2, 1971, when Carthage downed the Titans, 22-19. Home night game results since 1965:
